If the driver really wants to text, try reading their texts out loud to them. C'mon, you know you want access.



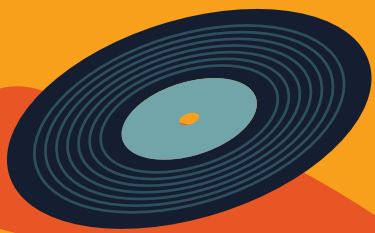
Be a Mime

Be the DJ

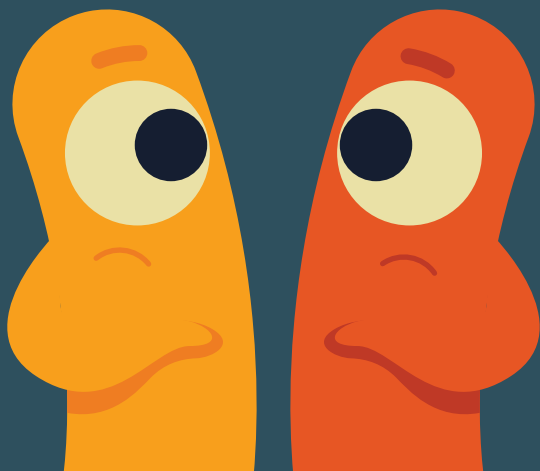
The driver shouldn't be scrolling through playlists. This way, you get to choose the music.
